Well done Year 1 for taking part so well in our visit to Whitstable Museum, as part of our history learning 'What was it like when you were young?' The children loved playing with old toys and costumes, playing a fun observation game and learning about the Invicta engine. A huge thank you to Peter and team at the museum and our parent volunteers who accompanied us. In Maths we've continued to learn about subtraction, and have begun the difficult challenge of finding all 8 facts in a fact family (e.g. 4 + 3 = 7, 3 + 4 = 7, 7 - 4 = 3, 7 - 3 = 4 ...) As our hook lesson in English, the children enjoyed making and tasting mince pies and used different adjectives in their writing to describe the experience (crunchy, golden, sweet, delicious, and for a couple of children - disgusting!) Next week we will be learning to recognise and name 3D and 2D shapes and will be writing thank you letters to Whitstable Museum. We worked hard on making and testing kites in DT and can't wait to share our songs with you at our two Christmas concerts.
