## Wellbeing Team

## Worship this term

We continue to work closely with Rev Rachel and the team at St. Alphege Church, to provide invitational, inclusive and engaging times for reflection and prayer. We have been reviewing our previous system for delivering worship to ensure it is as effective as it can be. In light of this, the pattern for our daily worship will change slightly this term. At the beginning and end of each term there will be whole school worship in Church, when families will be invited to join us. We hope that this will reduce the pressures on working parents with dates being given further in advance. ## Weekly Year Group Recap

### <u>Sunbeams</u>

#### From Mrs Keeble & Mrs Humphreys

This week in Sunbeams we read The Naughty Bus to inspire our own small world play with the dinosaurs. Small world play helps to develop lots of skills, such as language, collaboration and imagination. We had some very cheeky dinosaurs and built some impressive small world environments using natural resources, building blocks and blankets. We even built a bridge to the water table so that our dinosaurs could take a dip! Mrs Memmott played a musical game which involved using our listening skills and pointing to the different parts of our body. We loved watching her play the guitar and chose songs to sing that she could play along to. We have been playing subitising games to quicken our recognition of small groups of objects. In HeartSmart we thought about the people we love and live in our homes. We then drew the members of our household to display in the nursery and to remind us we are loved too.

### Year R

#### From Mrs Arnott & Mr Mead

This week Reception have been exploring different types of land transport. We thought about how we get to school and looked at old and new transport. We saw lots of similarities and differences and spoke about what it might have been like to travel to school in the past. This week in English we read Mrs Armitage on Wheels. We loved the story and found it very funny as she kept adding different things to her bike. The children then thought about what they would like to add to their bike and invented their own creations. Everyone then tried really hard to write some lovely sentences explaining what they would add to their bike. In maths this week we have been delving into measuring. We used objects such as cubes, paperclips and dominoes to measure things around the classroom. We spoke about using the correct language such as longer, shorter, taller etc. The children loved going outside and drawing around each other and then using their hands to measure how long each other was when lying down. Everyone has amazed us in phonics this week, we have been learning the digraphs oo, oo, ar and oi.

## <u>Year 1</u>

#### From Mrs Jones & Mrs O'Malley

Well done to Year 1 for another fun packed week of learning! The children loved describing the hot and cold countries visited by the penguins in our fiction text 'Poles Apart'. They went on to compare the countries using the -er suffix (e.g. hotter, colder). In Maths we have been partitioning (splitting) teen numbers into tens and ones and saying for example 'My number is 14, I have one ten and four ones.' We really enjoyed singing, moving to Japanese drums and exploring the sounds of different drums in music. The children had to sing 'What do you wish for?' and there were some lovely choices! Our big question in RE is 'What is the Good News Jesus' bring?' and this week the children used drama to re-tell the story of Mathew the tax collector. Next week in Maths we will be learning more about number lines and using them to problem solve. We will be re-telling the story 'Lost and Found' by Oliver Jeffers, using the -ed suffix, e.g. asked, rowed. Don't forget: PE is now every Monday and Tuesday and new phonics reading books are online every Monday – please read every day to help your child build fluency (passwords are in the front of your child's reading record).

## Year 2

### From Mrs Swindells & Mrs O'Keeffe

We have had a fantastic week in Year 2! Thank you so much to the king Grandparent who let us look at WW2 artefacts – the children loved seeing wreckage. gas masks, alarms and helmets from the war. This helped them to sort pictures into soldiers from the past and present and compare them with each other. The children have been writing diary entries this week and we are blown away by their fantastic use of imagination and vocabulary used! Next week we will continue to learn about WW2 and focus on how families protected themselves. In English we will continue to write in our diaries and learn to exciting vocabulary to describe events in the past. In Maths we will begin to divide by sharing in equal groups and begin to think about the relationship between multiplication and division. In art we will be focusing on mono printing and learning how to create our own WW2 inspired print. We will continue to build on our hockey skills and begin to shoot the ball at targets to increase our accuracy. We will also learn and explore different ways to travel in gymnastics.
