Bailey Yanik Cup



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King Alphege is awarded to the class with the highest percentage attendance each week.








We have had an amazing couple of weeks together! The children absolutely loved our text 'Somebody Swallowed Stanley' – it was a great way to introduce the children, in a gentle and accessible way, to the problems of plastic pollution in our seas. It inspired some descriptive writing about whales, turtles and seagulls! On Monday we were delighted to welcome John Halladay from Greenpeace - the children learnt all about deforestation, plastic pollution and what we can do to reduce, reuse, repair and recycle. We would love to know what you are doing at home to help look after our common home. Our art ambassadors also helped us all to make some brilliant green hearts to #show the love for the environment, alongside the Climate Coalition. Have you seen them in the windows along the high street? In Maths we have been learning to double numbers, subtract back from 20 and have practised quick recall of number bonds to 20 (e.g. knowing that 2 + 18 = 20 or 5 + 15 = 20). We have all really enjoyed our abstract art inspired by Kandinsky - the children created some stunning paintings using hot and cold colours and different tools.

On the first Monday after half term we will be going for a walk through Whitstable as part of our new learning in history – please remember to wrap up warm. We hope you have a lovely half term. Take care.
