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King Alphege is awarded to the class with the highest percentage attendance each week.








Sunbeams

From Mrs Keeble & Mrs Humphreys

This week in Sunbeams we have continued to explore pattern. We have learned about repeating patterns and have begun to copy or complete them. Some of us have managed to create our own! Mrs Memmott showed us a firework display that was accompanied by classical music. We then moved to the music with scarves, not unlike our Squiggle While You Wiggle, except we moved in different ways in response to the music we are listening to. We have been thinking about Remembrance Day and how the poppies we see are a visual reminder of the very many people who served our country and helped us a very long time ago and since. We have remembered times in our own lives when people have helped us and it was lovely hearing the examples the children gave.

Year R

From Mrs Arnott & Mr Mead

We have had a great wee. In English we have been exploring the nursery rhyme of Incy Wincy Spider. All the children made their very own spiders and then took them all on their own adventures. Everyone then made us very proud by writing their own sentences of where their spider climbed. In phonics we have been learning the sounds: v, w, x and y. We have also been working hard in learning some very tricky words including has, had, his and her. We have continued thinking about History this week and learning all about the meaning of Remembrance Day. We thought a lot about our own feelings and how others might be feeling on this day. The children created some lovely pieces of poppy themed artwork. All the children had a great time in PE this week where we have continued exploring different types of dance – this week was the turn of hip hop and breakdance! Well done Reception for another great week!

Year 1

From Mrs Jones & Mrs O'Malley

It has been a full and busy week in Pearl Class and Oyster Class. The children have continued their learning about Traditional Tales with an audio and musical version of 'Little Red Riding Hood', discussing how the story teller uses voice to represent different characters and moods in the story, and thinking about using statements to explain and describe. They have continued to develop their number and addition skills in Maths by starting to use number lines and how to use them to add two numbers together.

In D&T (Design and Technology) we have introduced a new project, and over the next few weeks we will be planning and designing a kite! We began this week by looking at different ways to join and connect materials and equipment, and the children worked alone, in pairs and in small teams to practise creating hinges in construction kits, or using junk modelling materials to find more than one way to join at least two pieces. We will be going outside next week to attempt to fly a shop-bought kite, which we will then disassemble back in school so that we can look at the different components before going on to draft a design and select materials for our own kites. Watch this space for some budding designers to emerge!

Thank you to all of you who have shared old toys and photographs from your family collections as we continue our learning on timelines in History. So far, we have a front runner for oldest toy – a Grandpa's teddy which is 65+ years old! This teddy (known as 'Ted') took pride of place when we had our class discussion, being placed as 'oldest' on our timeline!

Year 2

From Mrs Swindells & Mrs O'Keeffe

It has been another wonderful week in Year 2! We loved learning about different life cycles in science and using drama to act them out! We thought about air pollution and have set up an experiment to test the cleanliness of the air in different areas of our school. This involved a plate, masking tape and some Vaseline. We can't wait to reveal the results next week! In maths next week we will be learning to add money and values up to £2. We will also be finding different combinations of totals. In English we will continue to read 'Greta and the Giants' and will be re-writing the story using ourselves as the main character. We will be using adjectives to describe, using verbs and adverbs to explain how a forest is being chopped down. In geography we will be learning all about water pollution and how it affects our world. We will also be learning what animals and humans need to survive and creating a habitat suitable for them to live in.
