



This week in Sunbeams we have begun exploring size. We read the story Lazy Ozzie and noticed how Lazy Ozzie used the other farm animals in decreasing order of size to get down from his perch. We went on to compare size using natural objects around us including a variety of pumpkins which were all very different! We used our noticing skills to discover the differences in how they look as well as in their size. We have been practicing our scissor skills too and have been learning how to hold our scissors correctly and effectively when snipping or cutting into paper and other materials. Don't forget that on Tuesday 18th October, Sunbeams will be walking to Stream Walk Community Gardens. The trip will include the Sunbeams that are attending the morning session that day. Please ensure that your child wears a puddle suit and welly boots for our trip (we will put them on the children if they are kept in Sunbeams).

Year R

From Mrs Arnott & Mr Mead

We have had a great week in Reception this week. In English we have been reading The Little Red Hen. We retold the story by drawing story maps and remembering the repeated phrases. On Wednesday we made our own bread and thought carefully about each step just like little red hen. It was delicious! The children then created their own set of instructions using photographs, labels and even some amazing writing! In maths we have been exploring repeated patterns. We have had a lovely time getting creative and creating our own repeated patterns using colour, shapes, objects and even natural autumnal resources. This week the children have been learning about Harvest and how we celebrate Harvest festival, we are excited to visit church for the first time next Monday to see some of the signs of Harvest. This week it was Pebble's turn to visit Stream Walk. The children had a wonderful time smelling, touching and tasting different vegetables and learning all about the process of planting seeds, ploughing and harvesting. Everyone is very thankful for our farmers! On Friday the children did some very grown up thinking around Black History Month. We learnt about some very important people including Martin Luther King and Rosa Parks and even listened to some incredible guitar skills from Jimi Hendrix! Well done for a fab week!

Year 1

From Mrs Jones & Mrs O'Malley

Thanks for another brilliant week, Year 1! We were so impressed with the children's enthusiasm when writing about their visit to Duncan Downs. It was wonderful to see them so motivated. In Maths this week we will be learning that when we add two numbers, we can swap the parts (e.g. 3 + 4 is the same as 4 + 3) and we will use this knowledge to help us learn and write addition facts. We will read 'The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch' - a story about a seagull who eats a mustard sandwich! We will be designing and describing our own sandwich using exciting adjectives. We hope to see lots of seagulls on Monday morning when we visit the beach, harbour and lifeboat station. We will be learning more about the special features of Whitstable and developing our map skills. Don't forget a waterproof coat in case of rain! We will continue to mark Black History Month by learning about Marcus Rashford and Martin Luther King and in PE will use a map to orienteer in the playground.

Year 2

From Mrs Swindells & Mrs O'Keeffe

It has been another great week in Year 2 this week! We have been learning to use adjectives and verbs to describe food and the way in which we eat. We then wrote a persuasive menu based on the story 'A cooked up Fairy tale.' Next week we will be continuing with the story and writing instructions for how to make a pizza using imperative verbs (put, add, chop) and fronted adverbials (first, next, then). In Maths we will be building on our knowledge of adding 2-digit and 2-digit numbers and learning how to add using column addition. We will continue to learn about Black History Month and focus on Harriet Tubman and the impact she had. We will also be completing a 'Flashback Friday' guiz where will we recap our learning throughout the term to help us to remember our knowledge! Next week we will be visiting Duncan Downs. Puffins will be going on Monday 17th and Seagulls will be going on either Wednesday 19th or Thursday 20th. Please see the list of names outside the Year 2 door which outlines the day your child will be going. Children will need to bring a warm, waterproof coat and wellies/sensible shoes to change in to.
