
Sunbeams Stay and Play Sessions



Sunbeams From Mrs Humphreys

This week in Sunbeams we have welcomed several new children into our setting. We are enjoying getting to know our new Sunbeams as we support them to settle in. We have been remembering some of the fun things we got up to over the Easter holidays and have drawn pictures to represent some of the activities we've talked about. We've been doing lots of activities to support our fine motor skill development and pen control as well as encouraging our Sunbeams to have a go at writing their name – some of our Sunbeams are writing their names really clearly! Ten tiny but very hungry caterpillars arrived on Monday and we have been observing them closely each day so that we can notice any changes that take place. On Monday we noticed that they were about the size of a grain of rice. By Friday, some of them were the length of a broad bean! Next week we will be learning more about the life cycle of the caterpillar as we continue to observe any changes.

<u>Year R</u>

Reception have had a great first week back at school! It was lovely to hear all about how many Easter eggs we all had and everyone's holiday fun! We got straight back into the swing of things by exploring our new theme for this term – Minibeasts! In English we kickstarted the new theme by reading our new focus text 'Mad about Minibeasts!'. We visited the nest and Cornwallis Park to search for minibeasts, went pond dipping at Whitstable Junior School and visited the beach to collect resources for our transient art minibeasts! In maths this week we have been exploring our first teen numbers – 11-15. We did some very tricky thinking and activities to better understand place value and what each number means. In PE we started our new topic Athletics! We started by looking at sprinting and even watched how quick Usain Bolt can run. Well done everyone for starting Term 5 so well, have a lovely weekend!

<u>Year 1</u>

From Miss Hughes & Mrs O'Malley

Welcome back everyone! We have had a fabulous first week, starting our new topic 'Can you show me the way to go?' Our focus text for this term is Dogger, by Shirley Hughes. Dogger is a classic children's text, and tells the story of a little boy, Dave, and his favourite cuddly toy, an old brown dog. Dave loves Dogger, but one day Dogger goes missing! With help from his family, and a very kind big sister, Dogger is found again! This week, the children brought in their own favourite cuddlies, told stories about them, acted out searching for them and drew pictures and wrote captions. Next week, we will work on adjectives to describe.

In Maths, we introduced counting in equal groups, and next week we will introduce arrays and using arrays to find doubles. In RE this term, we are earning about Judaism. What do Jewish people believe, where do they worship, what objects are special to them? At the end of term, we hope to arrange a visit to Chatham Memorial Synagogue to have an educational talk. Our new focus artist this term is Chila Birnam CBE, a British-Asian artist who makes art in many forms. We will focus on the skills of composition and texture, and make layered collages. In Science, we are learning about humans and the senses, starting our learning off with a senses hunt in the playground. What could we see/hear/smell/touch?

The big piece of news is to remind you that Y1 start their block of swimming lessons next week, Friday 26th April, for 10 Fridays. Please ensure your child is wearing their swimming kit underneath their school uniform, and has a change of underwear and a towel in an appropriate bag. We will walk to and from the pool, and the children will have a snack of a biscuit after swimming, which we will provide. Have a brilliant weekend!

<u>Year 2</u>

From Mrs O'Keeffe and Mrs Cook

We have had a 'SOCK-TASTIC' start to our band new term in Year 2! We have loved welcoming our children back after the Easter Break and enjoyed a week full of fresh learning across all our curriculum. Children have loved reading our new English text 'Simon Sock' and for Imagination Week, they have made sock puppets, designed a new character for the story and even dazzled on the catwalk for Odd Sock Day. Next week, they will begin to write their first draft of a wanted poster for a missing sock. We have begun to explore our new big learning question 'Who has Helped Change the World?' and children thought about who is important to them and helped change their own world. Next week, we welcome Ian from KIC theatre to 'kick' start our big learning theme of social injustice and the civil rights movement, linked to our big question. The children have begun to learn how to dribble using a basketball in PE and will continue to develop their team work skills throughout the term. They loved discovering more about Faith Ringgold in our Textiles unit for Art and exploring mark making with a range of medium on different types of fabric. Next week, children will be visiting Duncan Downs for their science lesson (please see additional information and dates on the newsletter), beginning to learn how to sew in Art and learning about the Prophet Muhammed in our new RE unit 'Islam.'
