We particularly liked learning about and looking after the lost sheep, before we returned it to the school hall for their afternoon worship. We have been doing a variety of different activities to support our fine motor development this week, using both our fingers for a pincer grip or tweezers to pick up and transport, or carefully place tiny objects. On Friday we talked about empathy as we watched a Bluey episode and reflected on the feelings of the characters in it. We then linked our empathy for others to Red Nose Day, where money is raised to help those who are less fortunate than many of us.

This week Reception have been very busy. We had a wonderful time visiting Whitstable Castle and looking around the gardens for signs of spring. We saw lots of lovely new buds and shoots growing and enjoyed spotting the daffodils and snowdrops! We linked this learning to our RE this week where we thought about the importance of Easter for Christians and how this time of year can be remembered as New Life. All the children created their own beautiful and colourful flowers which we stuck on to a cross to represent new life. In English this week the children have been thinking about the different parts of a plan, they created their own still life drawings and then labelled the different parts. We also enjoyed planting our very own seeds and can't wait to watch them grow. In maths this week we have been exploring the concept of doubling. We used mirrors, made numicon butterflies and printed paint to help us solve some of our doubling challenges. We had a lovely day on Friday celebrating Comic Relief where we learnt about what the charity does and how we can all help.

We have had another busy week in Year 2 this week! In maths we have been using clocks to tell the time, learning about o'clock, half past, quarter to and quarter past, exploring this both practically and by recording in our maths books. In English we have finished our work on the book 'The Water Princess' with our production writing. We have been imagining that we are a Prince or Princess ourselves making that journey to collect water and recalling when we walked to Whitstable Beach at the start of term to inspire our writing. In Art we have been continuing to explore the idea of sculpture, this week making a mixed media sculpture of a tree in groups, thinking carefully about what media we can use to make them. Next week we will be visiting the beach to make transient sculptures there. We have continued learning about habitats in science, focusing this week on micro habitats. We visited The Nest to see what creatures we could find there to support our learning. Next week we will be moving onto learning about mass and capacity in maths and making cakes on Monday to support our instruction writing for the rest of the week.
