Thank you for sending your child to school in the correct uniform each day. Uniform is an important part of being in school as it helps to give children a sense of belonging and community. Please make sure your child's uniform is named so that we can return any misplaced items to the correct owner! We fully appreciate the financial challenges that we are all facing at the moment with the rising cost of living and how providing uniform can be another expense for families. At the end of last academic year, if the children had outgrown their school shoes, we allowed them to come into school wearing their trainers to save parents added expense at the end of the summer term. Shoes should be all black and appropriate for the variety of activities that we do during the day. Uniform does not have to bear the school logo and can be picked up at supermarkets as long as the colours are correct. 

Weekly Year Group Recap

Sunbeams

From Mrs Humphreys

This week in Sunbeams we have been developing our phonic skills with musical games and a treasure chest of sound that encourages us to distinguish and differentiate between sounds. We have been playing lots of subitising games to develop our number sense, some of which the children have continued to play during their child initiated time, because they are so much fun. We have also been doing some autumnal themed fine motor activities, such as making playdough hedgehogs, adding the eyes and quills and using tweezers or a pincer grip with our fingers to transport seeds and pulses for various purposes. On Thursday afternoon we visited the greengrocers to learn more about where our fruit and vegetables come from. We noticed some that we didn't recognise as well as lots that we did. We will be exploring some of these food over the next few weeks.

Year R

From Mrs Keeble

Reception have had an amazing week and adapted well to the changes while Mrs Arnott and Mr Mead are spending time with their new babies! We have been sharing the book The Colour Monster in our English this week, developing our understanding of our emotions, and broadening our vocabulary to describe how we feel. In our phonics we continue to build on our growing repertoire of sounds, this week learning ck, e, u & r, and using them with other sounds we know to read simple cvc words. In our maths we have been learning about more and less and exploring this in practical ways both inside and outside using blocks and other resources. We have been thinking about the changes in seasons, looking more closely at the changes happening in autumn, finding things in our local environment for us to create with. We have used fallen leaves to make autumn collages and used crayons to make leaf rubbings. In RE we have been thinking about the creation story in the Bible and the importance for Christians in believing that God is the creator of all things.

Year 1

From Miss Hughes & Mrs O'Malley

Another wonderful week in Year 1 comes to an end! In our English lessons, we started reading a nonfiction book called 'Autumn is Here'. We looked at verbs this week, and wrote our own sentences with verbs we noticed from the story, such as: 'The geese and honking and flying'. In Maths, we continued learning about numbers up 10. We recapped the symbols for greater than/less than, then looked at number lines and how they can help us to recognise numbers, order them, and how they help us notice numbers that are greater or less than others. Other lovely moments from our week included: a game of stuck-in-the-mud, during our OAA PE lesson, reading for pleasure with our friends outside in the sunshine and creating some beautiful pumpkin Harvest paintings!

We had a wonderful time at Duncan Downs this week, we were looking for signs of Autumn, learning about what happens to trees in Autumn, and learning how to tell if a tree is deciduous or evergreen. Thank you Mr Thomas-Friend, for accompanying us!

Year 2

From Mrs Swindells & Mrs O'Keeffe

We have loved this week in Year 2! In History, we learnt more about the Romans and sorted pictures into 'Roman / not Roman'. We learnt all about the important things they invented, the foods they ate and the jobs they had – we began to compare their lives with our lives today. Next week we will think about different time periods and create our own time line! In English, we wrote letters as Goldilocks apologising for the cheeky activities we did around the school. We used a range of sentences including statements, questions and exclamations within our writing. Next week our focus story will be 'A cooked up Fairy tale'. We will be continuing to learn all about the use of adjectives and choosing suitable words to describe the taste and texture of a variety of foods. In Maths we will be learning to add 2-digit numbers together by using column addition. We have been learning about the Creation story in RE this week and will continue to think about how Christians look after the world.
