#### Welcome Back!

It has been wonderful to welcome our St Alphege family back to school this week. The buzz of excitement in school has been such a joy to see. All of our children have settled brilliantly into their new classes and we are so proud of how well they have coped with the transition. Our new Reception children are now in school full-time and we have been amazed at how quickly they have settled into their new environments and how confident they have appeared in school. The school is a happy, vibrant place and it is a joy to hear the laughter, singing and chatter. The shared joy of being back together in our school family is uplifting for us all!

#### **Breakfast Club and After School Club**

If your child attends Breakfast Club or After School Club please can you return the registration forms and signed agreement forms which have been sent home. After School Club invoices for the term will be sent home next week and are due for payment within 2 weeks. Breakfast Club invoices continue to be sent home weekly and are due for immediate payment.

#### **Nut Free School**

We have several children in school who suffer from nut allergies please could I remind everyone that our school and Nursery are "Nut Free Zones". Those children, if they come in contact with a nut product, can suffer life threatening consequences. A child with a nut allergy does not have to eat nuts themselves to react, it sometimes only needs to be a touch from someone who has eaten them. I cannot stress how important it is for everyone to work with us to ensure the safety of all our children.



This means that the following items cannot be bought into school or nursery;

- -Packs of nuts/any nuts
- -Peanut butter sandwiches
- -Fruit and cereal bars that contain nuts
- -Chocolate bars or sweets that contain nuts
- -Cakes made with nuts
- -Nutella
- -Chocolates
- -Baklava
- -Nougat
- -Biscuits (Check all biscuit labels and if you are not sure please leave it out).

Many foods will contain the wording:

- May contain traces of nuts
- We cannot guarantee that this product does not contain nuts
- Produced in a factory which handles nut ingredients

We do not expect you to avoid all of these foods, just those which directly contain nuts or nut products. Please help us in providing a nut free school, minimising the risk for children as much as possible and assisting those parents who have children who may have a life threatening reaction.
