Worship this term

We continue to work closely with Rev Rachel and the team at St. Alphege Church, to provide invitational, inclusive and engaging times for reflection and prayer. We have been reviewing our previous system for delivering worship to ensure it is as effective as it can be. In light of this, the pattern for our daily worship will change slightly this term. At the beginning and end of each term there will be whole school worship in Church, when families will be invited to join us. We hope that this will reduce the pressures on working parents with dates being given further in advance. This week in Sunbeams we have continued to develop our positional vocabulary through practical activities. We made an obstacle course outside and explored the different ways and directions we could travel it, using our positional vocabulary to explain our position. We have begun to explore forces and have learned that a push and a pull are forces we can use to move or stop something. We have discovered that we can use our breath to blow or suck to create a push or pull force that we can use to manipulate things. We participated in a dinosaur themed KIC Theatre session on Thursday. Ian was very impressed with our listening skills and at how much we knew and shared with him about what we know about dinosaurs! We used our bodies, faces and voices when pretending to be different dinosaurs. We explored rhyme and movement with Mrs Memmott on Tuesday.

Oysters and Pearls have had such a lovely rich week of learning. Our week started off with a fantastic visit from two of our parents, Mrs Minhas and Mr Wikholm. Our parents visited us to help us with our learning in our Geography and English, linked to our topic 'Is it hot or is it cold?'

Mariam's family have roots in Bangladesh, Pakistan and Bahrain, and Gabriel's family have roots in Finland. Both parents came well equipped with photographs, information and funny family stories, and really helped us to understand the similarities and differences in lives in different parts of the world. It was an amazing afternoon and we are so grateful to our brilliant families for their time.

We then enjoyed a session with KIC theatre, in which we explored this knowledge through drama and talk, and also fun!

The creativity continues as we carry on our art work inspired by Kandinsky.

<u>Year R</u>

From Mrs Arnott & Mr Mead

We have had a great week in Reception. In English we have been exploring the world of hot air balloons. We watched video clips of festivals from around the world and spoke about how colourful and amazing the skies look with all the balloons flying around. The children came up with some lovely descriptive words to describe the hot air balloons they saw. We spoke about what adjectives are and then created our own bank to help with our writing. The children designed their own colourful balloons thinking carefully about patterns, shape and size. They then wrote some beautiful descriptive sentences describing their balloons, we were so impressed! Everyone is trying hard with their cursive writing. In phonics we have now finished all our phase 3 sounds and enjoyed learning new trigraphs ear and air. Following our English focus on hot air balloons we have also had fun exploring other types of air transport. We had great fun making our own paper aeroplanes on Friday and seeing who could fly their own the furthest. In maths we have been focussing on numbers 6, 7 and 8 and how these numbers are made. The children did a great job showing different ways of making the numbers and wrote some lovely number sentences. Well done everyone!

<u>Year 2</u>

Year 2 have had another wonderful week of learning. We started our week by baking a chocolate depression cake and learning how to ration it equally as a whole class. We then thought about how we would feel not being able to have the delicious treats and quantities of food that we are used to and wrote about this in our secret war diaries. We have been focusing on creating and describing arrays in maths which has helped us solve multiplications involving the 2's, 5's and 10's times tables. We have loved learning how to create relief prints in art and have been thinking about the importance of, and different reasons for Christian prayer.

Next week, we will be investigating the properties of materials by completing a 'hole in my bucket' experiment. We will be exploring which material is best to fix a leaky bucket and measuring the amount of water that escapes. We will be thinking about how to combine the gymnastic skills we have learnt this term to create individual routines travelling across a range of apparatus. For our History and English focus, we will be learning all about life as an evacuee, creating our own luggage labels and plotting journeys to safety across Britain.
