We are looking for donations of Christmas tree decorations/baubles for our communal tree in the school hall. Any donations would be greatly appreciated.






Friends Christmas Fair – Thursday 7th December 3.15pm

In maths the children have been exploring the numbers 4 and 5. The children enjoyed going on number hunts around the school and looking at different ways of arranging objects to show 4 and 5. Reception have continued to practice their nativity songs and we can't wait for you to hear them soon! In phonics we have been learning some very tricky digraphs - sh, th, ng and nk. We are so proud of how hard the children are working with their phonics and reading. This week we have also been exploring the celebration of Thanksgiving – we all thought about things we are thankful for and even got to taste some pumpkin pie! Have a lovely weekend everyone!

Year 1

Oysters and Pearls have enjoyed a busy and interesting week.

As part of our History learning, we enjoyed a fantastic visit to the Whitstable Museum, where we took part in a carousel of activities, learning about old clothes and toys, the Whitstable floods, and beach finds over the centuries. The children took part so well that Mr Banbury emailed the teachers to say what a wonderful group we were. Well done, Oysters and Pearls!

In Maths, we continue learning how to use a number line, but this week we are learning to subtract on a number line. This continues next week, when we use our knowledge of number fact families to improve our skills.

In English and RE we are learning the story of Jesus's birth, and finding nouns to help us learn about the different people and places in that story. We are also having daily practice of the songs we are learning for our Christmas production. Our singing is progressing beautifully. Wishing you all a lovely restful weekend.

<u>Year 2</u>

Year 2's week started with a 'How can I help?' day where we focussed on our Geography learning. We discussed different types of pollution including air, land and water as well as thinking about deforestation. We thought about the impact they all have on our world and completed a variety of activities representing each type to help us to see first hand the effect they have. We then thought about how we can make small changes to our daily lives to help the wonderful world we live in. In English we used our writing from last week about Greta and the Giants and expanded our sentences to make a narrative describing the setting. We immersed ourselves in the story and created our own characters who watched as giants chopped down trees and build houses in the nest! We used this experience to write a detailed narrative of a setting description and used valiant vocabulary throughout! Next week will be focussing on the text 'The blue giant'. We will be visiting the beach to use our senses and use onomatopoeia to describe the sounds in the environment. We will also be thinking about the impact of litter on our beach and help by litter picking while we are there. In maths next week we will be learning all about money and how to add coins to make a total. We will also be taking part in lots of Nativity practise so we are ready for our big performances!
