


Weekly Awards














Weekly Year Group Recap

Sunbeams

From Mrs Keeble & Mrs Humphreys

This week in Sunbeams we have been busy creating our own unique fish for 'You Be You' day. We have used lots of different media and materials when creating our fish. Some of the children chose to paint or draw their fish, while others used transient arts materials, such as buttons, stones, nuts and bolts to make theirs. We talked about how we all share some things in common but are also different from each other and that makes each of us unique and special! In HeartSmart we are learning about Boris the Robot who was made of junk from the scrapyard, but who is also unique and special and we have begun making our own Boris from junk modelling. We have been developing our subitising skills this week. Subitising is being able to see what the quantity is without counting. We have played games to encourage the children to spot groups of one, two or three. During our welcome time, we use counters with 10 frames to help develop our subitising skills and number sense further.

Year 1

From Miss Hughes & Mrs O'Malley

Here we are at the end of another busy week in Oysters and Pearls. In our English lessons, we have continued with our text 'Room on the Broom' with a focus on the characters voices and sounds. The children noticed many tiny details in the illustrations, too, pointing out links to other Julia Donaldson stories. In Maths, we continue learning about numbers within 10, looking at one more and one less and introducing equalities symbols for greater than/less than, using the rhyme 'Mrs Gator eats what's greater!' to help the children remember which symbol represents which. Next week, we will be introducing number lines and how to use them effectively. We linked Geography and Science with a lovely, blustery walk to the park at Cornwallis Circle. The children used their emerging mapping skills to go left, right and straight ahead as we looked for signs of Autumn, and we also had a cheeky play in the swing park! This continues next with a visit to Duncan Downs, led by our Forest School teacher, Mr Thomas-Friend. We will be learning about what happens to trees in Autumn, and how to tell if a tree is deciduous or evergreen. This week we also selected our reps for T.E.D team - Together Everyone Decides.

Year R

From Mrs Arnott & Mr Mead

Reception have had a lovely week. In English we read a story call This is our House by Michael Rosen. We thought about the importance of sharing with our friends and playing nicely. We then thought more deeply about houses and what our own homes are like. The children used new vocabulary to describe their house and collaged their own houses to fill them up with lots of furniture. In maths we have continued to explore lots of matching and sorting activities, this week we sorted by size, shape and colour. In Phonics this week we have covered q, o, c and k! These new sounds have really helped us reading our CVC words. In PE this week we continued our OAA learning. We had lots of challenges that we had to solve together including a fun hula-hoop traveling game! Finally, we worked really hard to create our own underwater creatures for our new school display. All the children created amazing and colourful creatures. They're going to look amazing in the hall. Well done Reception!

Year 2

From Mrs Swindells & Mrs O'Keeffe

Seagulls and Puffins have had a week full of fun! We started the week taking part in 'you be you' day and created our own unique sea creature using a range of resources. We can't wait to see them all on display in the hall! In art we have been learning to use drawing techniques to create tone by using a variety of pencils and exploring using different pressure to create effect. We absolutely loved reading 'The Ghanian Goldilocks' and had great fun pretending to be Goldilocks by doing a variety of cheeky things around the school. We did get caught gobbling some biscuits and playing on the reception patio though so we will be writing letters to the teachers next week to say sorry. We learnt about the Romans this week and completed a variety of activities to introduce us to their way of life. Next week we will be looking in more detail at their lives and comparing them to present day life.

In Maths we will be adding 2-digit numbers to 1-digit numbers and using out number knowledge to make links between number facts to help us (if we know that 2 + 3 = 5, then 12 + 3 = 15). We hope you have a lovely weekend Θ
