

We have enjoyed welcoming our Sunbeams back this week and hearing all about the exciting things they have been up to over the Christmas holidays. We have been recalling events and favourite presents and then mark making in response to this. We have been exploring a variety of objects and thinking about the vocabulary we can use to describe how they look and feel, before noticing some of the properties they share or are unique to them. We spent a lot of time on Thursday enjoying the dry weather (while it lasted) and spent a lot of time in our outside area engaged in water play. Some of us chose to use paint brushes with pots of water to mark make, some got stuck into digging the mud area while others set up guttering and investigated how much water it takes to push an object along the gutter. Please remember to pack plenty of spare clothes for your child as we are often getting wet and muddy!

Year 1

From Miss Hughes & Mrs O'Malley

Happy New Year to all of our families - we were so excited to welcome the children back to school this week. Our new learning question this term is 'Is it hot or is it cold?', and we started off our new topic by finding out about the Arctic, the Antarctic and the animals that live there. Next week, we be reinforcing our knowledge by learning about the equator and the different landscapes in hot and cold places. In maths, we are introducing place value, starting off with the teen numbers. We will be using a range of equipment and models such as ten-frames, dienes, and tens and ones boards to support our learning. In art, our focus artist for the term will be Kandinsky. This week, we explored mixing secondary colours from primary colours, and next week we will learn how to apply tints and shades to our painting. In English, we have a number of beautiful texts to explore deeply this term starting off with 'Lost and Found'. We will be listening to soundscapes of the sea, exploring the beach using our senses, and using non-fiction film clips and books to help support our understanding of the story. We look forward to sharing our learning in our weekly newsletters and on our school Facebook page, but please do not hesitate to ask if you would like to know anymore.

Year R

From Mrs Arnott and Mr Mead

Reception have had a lovely few days back at school. It has been wonderful to hear all of their lovely stories from their Christmas holidays. In English we have been thinking about what New Year Resolutions mean and the children have been coming up with their own New Year wishes. They all created their own beautiful Wishing wands. In phonics we have started phase 3 and have been looking at the digraphs and trigraphs this week - ai, ee, igh and oa. This week in maths Reception have been recalling adding facts 1-5 and learning about number bonds using part whole models. It has been very tricky but they have all worked reaaly hard. We have started our new theme for the term, Transport, and had a great day on Friday riding all our own scooters and bikes from home. We can't wait to get stuck in to our new learning. Well done for coming back so well Reception!

Year 2

From Mrs Swindells & Mrs O'Keeffe

Welcome back and Happy New Year! It has been wonderful to see the children again and find out all about their Christmas break. We started our week by thinking about hopes and wishes and understanding what a New Year's Resolution is and why some people make them. We thought about our hopes and wishes for this year and some of the things we would like to achieve. These were written on a shooting star that we created and are displayed in our classrooms! In Maths we completed lots of practical activities and games to recap our number and place value knowledge. Our new learning question for this Term is 'What happened before I was born?' and we will be focussing specifically on the significant event WW11. This week we were lucky enough to look through artefacts from the war and began to learn about how people kept safe throughout. Next week in History we will look closely at the military and compare similarities and differences between then and now. We will be learning all about materials in science this term and next week we will recap the different materials we learnt about in Year 1 and begin to think about their properties. In English we will be focussing on the book 'My Secret War Diary' and think about what a diary is and why people keep them. We will be thinking about how diaries are special to people and would love to discuss things that are special to us. Please can you bring in an object that is special to you for Monday. We will begin to imagine what it might have felt like during a raid and what it meant to ration food. In maths we will begin to learn about multiplication and division and will focus on making equal groups with objects and drawings.
