
Whole School Awards!

Weekly Year Group Recap

Sunbeams Mrs Humphreys

This week in Sunbeams we have been thinking about why we wear poppies at this time of year. We have talked about the brave men and women who have committed to keeping us safe and then tried to remember times when we have been brave or when others have helped us to be brave. We then used transient art, collage materials and paint to create our own poppies. We have continued to think more about pattern this week and have used our concentration and noticing skills to complete and recreate simple repeating patterns. Mrs Memmott played musical circle games with us on Tuesday, with lots of rhyme and movement. We have thoroughly enjoyed playing in our outside area this week, with all the fallen leaves providing a great deal of entertainment which has been lovely to see!

Year R Mrs Keeble and Mrs Jones

We started our week thinking about 'remembering', by joining in with the two minutes silence using the BBC children's remembrance film *Poppies*. Many children enjoyed painting and making their own poppies during learning through play. There has been a lot of excitement this week as we began 'Drawing Club'. Drawing club is not just about drawing – it is when all the children get to develop their vocabulary, speaking and writing skills through the joy and magic of story. This week, our focus was 'Room on a Broom.' The children were really motivated and enthusiastic as they brought their characters and adventures to life! Our phonics reading book this week was 'Pat a Pan', which you can access online at home. In Maths, we have been exploring how the number 3 can be made and have been learning that the total stays the same. We have spoken about the importance of brushing our teeth twice every day and to help at home you will find a toothbrush and toothpaste in your child's book bag. In music, we started practising songs for our nativity.

Year 1 Miss Hughes and Mr Mead

What a wonderfully busy week we have had in Year 1! We practised our best smiles when we had our school photos taken, and loved coming to school in our own clothes to celebrate 'Children In Need'. Thank you so much for the donations! We have been continuing to use verbs in our English lessons to describe how toys move. Can you practise using some verbs that end in -ing at home, to help us with our vocabulary? Maybe you could do some walking, reading, painting or playing at the weekend! In Maths we have been writing number sentences using a + and = sign. We have been amazing at remembering our number bonds to 10. Maybe you could quiz us on these on your way to school! We started learning about materials this week in Science, and found some in our classroom and on the patio. The materials we are identifying are: glass, plastic, metal, wood and paper. Can you find any of these materials at home? We loved learning some break-dancing moves in our P.E dance lesson this week, and had a great time practising our over-arm throws outside in our Games P.E. lesson. Well done for another wonderful week of learning! We are very proud!

Year 2

Mrs O'Keeffe and Mrs Cook

It's been another wonderful, busy week of learning in Year 2! In English it was Creation Week, and we used all the rich vocabulary we generated last week in Imagination Week to write a setting description of a polluted ocean. The children used powerful adjectives, verbs and even adverbs in their writing! Next week in Production Week we will be using our setting descriptions to write a narrative, imagining what a deep-sea diver would see when exploring the ocean. In Maths this week we turned our attention to subtraction, using a variety of methods to solve subtraction problems. We focused on taking away single digits from other single digit numbers, and then progressed to taking a one-digit number away from a two-digit number. Next week we will be subtracting multiples of 10 from two-digit numbers, and then subtracting two-digit numbers. In Science this week we looked at the properties of wood, paper and cardboard, and considered which material would be most suitable for uses such as a table or writing a letter. Next week we will be looking at the properties and uses of glass, plastic, metal, fabrics, brick and rock. In PE, as part of our Dance topic this term, the children impressed us with some amazing breakdancing moves! Next week we will be trying some ballet. We will also be learning about why Christmas is so important to Christians, and doing an experiment in Geography to find out how clean the air is in school! Over the weekend please could you have a chat with your child about why they were given their name and what it means? This is for a PSHE lesson next week. Have a lovely weekend!
