Nut Free School

We have several children and staff in school who suffer from severe nut allergies. Please could I remind everyone that our school and Nursery are "Nut Free Zones". Those children and staff, if they come in contact with a nut product, can suffer life threatening consequences. A child with a nut allergy does not have to eat nuts themselves to react, it sometimes only needs to be a touch from someone who has eaten them. I cannot stress how important it is for everyone to work with us to ensure the safety of all our children.

This means that the following items cannot be bought into school or nursery;

- -Packs of nuts/any nuts
- -Peanut butter sandwiches
- -Fruit and cereal bars that contain nuts
- -Chocolate bars or sweets that contain nuts
- -Cakes made with nuts
- -Nutella and chocolate spreads
- -Chocolates
- -Baklava
- -Nougat
- -Biscuits (Check all biscuit labels and if you are not sure please leave it out).



Many foods will contain the wording:

- May contain traces of nuts
- We cannot guarantee that this product does not contain nuts
- Produced in a factory which handles nut ingredients

We do not expect you to avoid all of these foods, just those which directly contain nuts or nut products. Please help us in providing a nut free school, minimising the risk for children as much as possible and assisting those parents who have children who may have a life threatening reaction.

Bikes and Scooters

Please can we remind everyone that bikes and scooters must not be ridden on school grounds. Sadly, one of our community members was injured following a collision with a scooter last week and we need to ensure everyone's safety whilst on site. We ask that you please ensure your children dismount at the school gates and walk their bike or scooter into school. Please can you ensure that if your child is super speedy in the mornings and arrives at the gates before you do, that they wait there for you so that you can accompany them on to the site. Thank you.

Could we please request the following from each child in Year 2 for next week:

Monday: Can children please bring in a white or plain coloured t-shirt which can be used to tie dye. Tues: Children can bring in a special object that has sentimental meaning to them to share in RE.



Weekly Year Group Recap

Sunbeams Mrs Humphreys

This week has been a short, but exciting week as we have been observing the changes in our caterpillars. We returned after the long weekend to find that they had grown considerably and today they look as though they may be almost ready to spin themselves a chrysalis! We can't wait to see what happens over the weekend when we return next Monday. We have also begun planting our own sunflower seeds. Mrs Humphreys planted some seeds last Friday and we have been observing the changes through the week and ensuring we water them. Not much happened until yesterday when we found that germination had taken place and the seeds are beginning to sprout! We will be exploring a lot of measure as our sunflowers grow over the next couple of weeks.

<u>Year R</u> <u>Mrs Keeble</u>

Continuing on our minibeast theme, we have started exploring a new book for our English/Drawing Club this week: 'Superworm.' We have been learning our new vocabulary: zooming, heroic, calamity and timid. These words have helped us to draw our worm and describe it. We discovered that during this week it was World Bee Day, and we were inspired to make bees and other minibeasts using pipe cleaners and other media. Our caterpillars have grown very big and we are waiting in anticipation for them to make their cocoons! In our maths learning, we have been consolidating our understanding of teen numbers in our independent work while beginning to learn about combining two small quantities on a ten frame and finding a total. We are continuing to develop our different athletic skills to get ready for our annual 'Sports Day' at the end of this term. This week we have been focusing on our throwing skills. In our RE lessons, we have been learning about different children of faith and how special stories are important for them. This week we learnt about why the story of David and Goliath helps Jewish people know that they can trust in God, and they find their special stories in the Torah scroll. Some of the children were then inspired in their learning through play to make their own scrolls with pictures and words.

Year 1 Mr Mead and Miss Thomas-Friend

In Year 1 this week, we have been creating our own 'polluted environments' using junk modelling, building blocks and recycled materials. We have been thinking scientifically and have had fabulous discussions around how we could improve the pollution in our environments. In English, we have moved into Production week this week and have begun creating our own Diaries in order to recount taking our teddies on an adventure and the shock of losing our fantastically described toys! Our Maths exploration this week has been focused on doubling and what this looks like within arrays. We have also been revisiting how to represent number sentences as arrays, using lots of manipulatives. We are collage-crazy- artists this term in Year 1! This week, we have explored how printing using unusual objects can create different lines, shapes and textures in our collages. This week, Year 1 lived up to the fabulous behaviour that they displayed on the way to, and in the swimming pool last week, representing their St Alphege family wonderfully!

Year 2 Mrs O'Keeffe and Mrs Cohen

It's been another brilliant and busy week in Year 2. The children have been learning how to persuasively write to an audience in English Production week, producing amazing missing reports for their sock characters. Next week, they will be drawing inspiration from the features of spring and learning how to using rhyming couplets to create a spring inspired poem. They have persevered to complete their felt hand puppet designs in Textiles and shown brilliant perseverance and concentration to sew and decorate their final pieces. In History, they listened to Martin Luther King Jr famous 'I have a dream' speech and learnt about his impact on the Civil Rights Movement. The children have begun to plan their own 'inequality scenarios,' designing characters, settings and settings before filming their stories come to life. Be sure to check Facebook for the final films! In RE, they are continuing to learn about the faith of Islam and next week will be learning about items that are special for Muslims and how they are looked after.
