



Weekly Year Group Recap

Sunbeams Mrs Humphreys

This week in Sunbeams we have been carrying out several investigations around ideas of floating and sinking. We explored different materials and objects, both natural and man made and made predictions as to whether we thought they would float or sink. We discovered that some materials are more likely to float than others. We carried out an investigation to see how many wooden blocks or stones we could place into a boat before it sank. We also used some buoyant polystyrene boards to build wooden towers on, investigating how tall we could build them before they toppled into the water. Given the heat we have had this week, we have very much enjoyed these water based activities!

<u>Year R</u> Mrs Keeble

Following our walk to the beach last week we have been using our retrieval skills to help us with our sentence writing in our Production week for Drawing Club. Not only have we been using memories of what we remembered seeing, hearing and smelling we have also been using our imaginations to add extra ideas of what we might find on a beach. In our Maths learning this week we have been developing our shape knowledge, identifying and naming 3D shapes and looking at their properties. We have engaged in a range of practical activities to explore 3D shapes including printing with them to make 2D shapes, using playdough to make 3D shapes and sorting the shapes according to their properties. We had a very exciting afternoon on Wednesday with the visit from the Olympic athlete. We engaged in the circuit challenges with gusto before listening to his inspiring story in an assembly. We were so inspired we were keen to explore our own athletic skills on the playground! We have been embracing engaging in our Rainbow challenges this week – creating beach pictures, seeing if we can make a boat for a snail to float in and using our retrieval skills again to recall the lifecycle of a butterfly. We are looking forward to Art Week next week and can't wait to share our masterpiece with you in the upcoming class display afternoon.

Year 1 Mr Mead and Miss Thomas-Friend

This week in Maths we have continued exploring numbers to 100, but have progressed into numbers being greater than, less than and Equal to each other. The wonderful Number Gator helped us to remember that she eats the greater number! In English we have completed our Production week, producing reflective stanzas about our time in Year 1. We will be working together to read each other's stanza's and select some to be combined into a big poem called 'In Year 1...'. Our Science learning this week certainly made us think about where our food comes from! We used our senses (particularly smell) to review what our homegrown cress tasted like inside an egg and cress sandwich. Year 1 made a real effort to try even a bite of the sandwiches (some even enjoyed two or three!). Despite the flavour not being to everyone's taste, we are very impressed with how well our cress, that had both sunlight and water, grew. We are beginning to think about how long it might take for other things that we eat to grow? In PE we practised our tag rugby skills, focusing on dodging, avoiding and finding space. In Year 1's History exploration, we have continued to focus on David Attenborough, his life and the good that he does for both animals and humans. We are continuing to understand the difference between Traditional books and E-books in Computing. Our E-Books have levelled up again, having now added sound to our animated story books! Our PSHE learning has again run through all that we have done this week. We explored obstacle courses- understanding the importance of cheering each other, and ourselves on when things get challenging! This was a message that Sam Mostowfi, the Team GB Gymnast who visited us this week, also shared. He told us about his inspirational journey into gymnastics and then gave us the opportunity to practise our own perseverance in a touch sports and gymnastics circuit. Yet again, swimming has been one of the highlights of the week. Year 1 continue to display wonderful behaviour when going swimming. This week they excelled in their pool safety as it was National Drowning Prevention Week. We explored what to do in the water when you can't touch the ground and knowing when to swim and when to float like a starfish! Next week (27th) will sadly be our last swimming session. I know lots of us will miss going every Friday, what a wonderful few weeks it has been! Have a great weekend, we look forward to seeing you next week!
