

Weekly Year Group Recap

Sunbeams Mrs Humphreys

Wow! What a busy week this has been! We have had lots of fun with Art Week and with the visit from Jo at Animate Art. We have been inspired in our art work by artists such as Henri Matisse and Andy Warhol. We have found opportunities to practice our scissor skills and develop our vocabulary around the property of shape while producing a paper collage. We have continued our pattern work and have used transient art or paint to create our own patterns, some of which have been repeating. Jo set us the challenge to create our own version of Andy Warhol's "32 Cans of Soup". Again, we were able to practice our scissor skills and also our writing skills as we had a go at writing the name of the soup on our art work. Please can you remember that sandals and crocs are not suitable for nursery as it is not safe for the children to climb the equipment or when they are running at speed around the outside area. Please send your child in with trainers or shoes, preferably Velcro so that they can manage them themselves. Also, ensure you send your child in with spare clothes as they are getting involved in a lot of water play at the moment and often need changing. Our spares do not always get returned and we have run out of clothes that we can lend the children.

<u>Year R</u> <u>Mrs Keeble</u>

What a brilliant week we have had this week exploring Art and Maths together. We have incorporated our previous learning about shapes and have used these in a range of ways to create art. In maths we have been using shapes to create and recreate patterns, using paint, transient art materials; and pegs and peg boards. We have been learning about different artists and working to recreate artwork in their style. At the beginning of the week, we studied work by Sonia Delaunay. She made abstract paintings using geometric shapes. We used rulers and shapes to create our art before using paints to add colour. We also studied the work of Minnie Pwerle, an aboriginal artist. We studied her art and used pastels, lolly sticks and paint to recreate art in her aboriginal style. We were also excited to have a workshop with Jo from Animate Arts on Wednesday. She tasked us with the challenge of creating a piece of art using paper and card to be displayed in the lower staircase. We look forward to welcoming you all in to our sharing the learning afternoon next Tuesday to see all our wonderful creations.

Year 1 Mr Mead and Miss Thomas-Friend

This it was our Imagination Week in Year 1, we have been exploring Non-Fiction texts. We have created our own fact files about ourselves AND about the world around us. What a worldly-wise year group we are! Within our exploration of facts, we have been comparing the difference between what is fact and what is our opinion. Year 1 have been sharing their expert knowledge and reminding Mr. Mead that 'Chelsea being the best football club' is unfortunately not a fact. We are very excited to begin our next week of learning with such a wide range of interesting facts. In our Maths learning this week we have been focussing on the value of money! We have been practising recognising different coins and using our knowledge of counting in 2's, 5's, and 10's to help us calculate the amount of a group of coins. Art week has flown by! What a creative week this week has been, we produced so much fabulous maths inspired artwork this week, that we can't wait to show you! On Monday we focused on symmetrical and repeating patterns using geometric shapes, taking inspiration from Islamic and Ancient Greek art to inspire us! Then on Tuesday we used our previous learning of geometric shapes to create some optical illusions. We were mesmerised! Bridget Riley provided us with tons of inspiration, we created fabulous paintings using lots of different shapes. Wednesday brought new creative excitement as Jo from Animate Arts paid us a visit! We have embarked upon a new project which will live in the Year 2 Stairway. In Year 1 our fabulous shape-inspired artworks were 'The Three Musicians' by Pablo Picasso and 'The Son of Man' by Rene Magritte! Whilst continuing to work on our masterpieces, we created our own geometric stained-glass window artworks. We loved watching the sun shine through these throughout the day. We ended our week on Friday, slightly sad that it was our last swimming, but happily remembering all of the fun that we have had, and things that we have learnt! It has been a great week this week, Year 1 have dealt so well with the heat and the excitement of Art week. We hope that you have a fabulous weekend and are already looking forward to seeing you on Monday!
