



Weekly Year Group Recap

<u>Sunbeams</u> <u>Mrs Humphreys</u>

This week in Sunbeams we are learning about Boris the Robot who is made of junk from the scrapyard. Boris sometimes feels worthless because the Scrapman makes him feel like the junk he's made of, but Boris meets a family who love him and make him feel special. We talked about how we can all feel 'rubbish' at times, but then feel happy and loved at other times because of the special people in our lives. We then begun making our own Boris from junk modelling. We have begun to develop our subitising skills this week. Subitising is being able to see what the quantity is without counting. We have played games to encourage the children to spot groups if one, two or three. During our welcome time, we use counters with 10 frames to help develop our subitising skills and number sense further. Although the sun is still largely shining, it is definitely feeling cooler in the mornings and in the shade so please make sure your child brings a coat in with them whatever the weather, just in case it is needed.

<u>Year R</u> <u>Mrs Keeble and Mrs Hopkins</u>

We have enjoyed another lovely week together in reception. The children are enjoying learning their phonics sounds (this week i, n, m and d) and are learning to blend sounds to read words such as s-a-t and m-a-n. In Maths we have continued to practice subitising and have been learning to match and sort different objects according to different criteria. The children have enjoyed meeting Lily, our Christian persona doll. Lily shared with the children that God was very important to her and helped the children to think about and draw who was important to them. Thank you if you have been able to share a school book with your child this week. You will find a different wordless book in your child's book bag for the week ahead. We will be starting PE on Wednesday. Please make sure your child has a named PE kit in school at all times. We will practise changing into our PE kits independently. You might like to practise doing this at home over the weekend, encouraging your child to do this by themselves.

Year 1

Mrs O'Keeffe and Mr Mead

What a wonderful week we have all had in Year 1. The children have been dazzling us with their learning and have enjoyed earning lots of P.O.L.A.R stickers linked to our school plan! In English, they used their vocabulary from Creation Week, to write instructions to make a delicious jam sandwich. We were very impressed with their use of adjectives in verbs in their Powerful Writing. We will being a new Imagination Week next week, exploring the question 'How has Whitstable Changed over time' The children will be exploring the Geography and History of Whitstable in engaging and fun ways to inform their writing. In their Amazing Maths, the children have been consolidating their learning of counting backwards and finding one less of a number within 10. Next week, they will begin to use subject specific language to compare value and numbers. This week we began to look at our Focus Artist, Friedensreich Hundertwasser. It was lovely to welcome our families and careers into our classrooms at the end of our Art lesson, where the children could show off their colourful mark making skills. They will use these skills in the upcoming weeks to redesign Whitstable high street in Hundertwasser's vibrant style. The children have loved our Outdoor Adventurous Activities in PE this week too, where they have continued to build on their team work skills, solving challenges that involve communication, thinking and problem solving together. They've also been exploring how to improve their agility, movement, throwing, catching and rolling in Multi-skills PE Lessons too. We hope all our families enjoy a weekend of special moments together and we look forward to seeing you all again on Monday.

Year 2

Mrs Martin and Mrs Cohen

This week Year 2 have had lots of fun, practical learning all about using number lines to count in 1s and 10s. They took their learning outside and drew giant number lines before filling in the intervals either forwards or backwards while counting in steps. They also used number lines to estimate where a number would be, thinking carefully about the difference between the intervals. Next week in maths they will be comparing objects and numbers using greater than >, less than < and equal to = as well as ordering numbers. In English they had their first 'Production Week' in their English sequence. They thought carefully about how a postcard is written casually because they are typically to friends and families. The children used their short sentences from last week and expanded them, using adjectives to describe the setting and verbs to explain what they have been doing to write a postcard – we are so impressed with their finished writing! In art, they focused on drawing techniques and practised using different tools to create a variety of effects. Next week they will focus on using sketching pencils and learn how to create form to make a drawing appear 3D. We also learnt about Amelia Earhart this week and why she is remembered. We created small planes to fly over a world map to track her flights and ordered a time line of her life. Next week we will continue to learn more about her and why she is a significant figure in History. Wishing all of our families a happy weekend.
