Weekly Year Group Recap

Sunbeams Mrs Humphreys

This week in Sunbeams we have begun to learn about the story of Christmas. This is in preparation for our Nativity to which you are all invited. We have listened to lots of different books that all tell the same story and towards the end of the week we acted out different elements of the story to completely immerse ourselves in it. Next week we will be giving the children opportunities to retell the story in their own words, which will be the story we share with you – so be prepared for some surprising and little-known facts about the birth of Jesus! We have spent the week practicing our scissor skills, cutting out pictures of toys that have caught our eye in the toy catalogue and sticking them onto our letter to Father Christmas. Next week we will be posting our letters and hopefully your child will receive a reply in the post before Christmas from the man himself!

<u>Year R</u> <u>Mrs Keeble and Mrs Hopkins</u>

What another wonderful week we have had in Reception. In our Drawing Club sessions this week we have watched a festive Pingu clip to spark our imaginative drawings and mark makings, learning our new linked vocabulary of Celestial, Waddle, Prepare and Blast. In our Maths we have begun to explore shapes, comparing circles and triangles and the properties we notice. In our phonics we have finished learning all of our new sounds for the term and will be using these over the next few weeks to build our blending and reading skills. Our phonics reading book this week was Tap it Tad! This will be available for your children to you at home via our Collins Hub link. In our RE learning we are learning about the birth of Jesus and have enjoyed having nativity characters in play for us to engage with. Now that the weather has changed and is much colder the children have been enjoying the bikes more on the patio along with gross motor activities to keep them moving and warm when outside. We look forward to sharing our craft morning with you on Thursday at 9.30 in the hall next week if you are able to join us.

Year 1 Mrs O'Keeffe and Mr Mead

We have had another brilliant week in Year 1 this week! This week in Geography the children have been learning the 4 countries that make up the United Kingdom. We made maps of the UK and labelled the countries in the correct locations. The children then listen to where dinosaur fossils were found and had to stick them in the country where they were discovered. In science, we retrieved our learning about the 5 different animal groups and then looked at what they eat! We learnt that you can categorise animals into Herbivores, Carnivores and Omnivores. In Maths we have used our knowledge of number bonds within 10 to find the number bonds to 10! We worked systematically to find all the ways of making 10. The children learnt a number bus song and used it to write all the number sentences in their maths books. In English, it has been our Creation week! Our focus has been on rhyming words within Poetry. We looked at how when letters at the end of words sound the same, they rhyme! The children chose words to stick in their English book and then recorded as many words as possible that rhymed with their word. In PE the children explored another new dance style this week in Tap Dance. We enjoyed listening to the rhythm of Music and how professional Tap dancers use their special tap shoes when dancing. We hope you all have a fantastic weekend and we can't wait to see you next week for the start of the Christmas countdown!

Year 2 Mrs Martin and Mrs Cohen

Another exciting week has been had by Year 2 this week! The children had an amazing time at their last swimming lesson and we are so proud of how much they have achieved over the last ten weeks! In maths the children have continued to amaze us with their number bond knowledge and use this to add by crossing over ten, exchanging ten ones for one ten and finding equivalent sums! Next week the children will begin subtracting and continue to use their number bond knowledge to do so. In English the children had an exciting start to the week as they had a visit from Toby the tortoise! They loved looking after him and used him as inspiration for their writing by asking questions from his perspective. They will use the questions they wrote this week in their Production week next week where they will be writing a letter from the Space Tortoise to the animals in the sky to find out all about their world! In art the children explored painting on different surfaces and discussed how the paint looks and feels on different textures. They then chose a planet and suitable materials to paint on to replicate the planets rough, smooth or bumpy surface. In PE they followed an Irish Dance tutorial before choreographing their own version and performing it to the class – next week we will explore Bollywood! In History we learnt about Neil Armstrong and what was required to go to the moon. Next week our History will follow on from this and the children will look at Earth from Space and create their own telescopes and satellite images! We hope you all have a restful weekend.
