Weekly Year Group Recap

Sunbeams Mrs Humphreys

This week in Sunbeams we have been exploring pattern. We read the book 'Can you see Sassoon?' and noticed all the different patterns shown in the illustrations. Some of us noticed we were wearing clothes that had similar patterns on! We created our own stripy patterned snake and played games to support the development of our noticing skills and awareness of pattern. Mrs Memmott sang songs with us on Tuesday that built their own patterns as we sang through the verses. In our HeartSmart session this week we recognised how special each of us is and that the people who love us think we are special too. We then made our own crowns to remind us how special we all are. As the weather is getting cooler, please can we remind you that the children will need to bring coats in with them every day for their comfort when playing outside. We'd also like to invite all our Sunbeams families to join us for a stay and play session on Thursday 6th November at 2:15pm. If it is not your child's usual session, feel free to pop in with them for a play.

<u>Year R</u> <u>Mrs Keeble and Mrs Hopkins</u>

It has been so good to be back at school with your fantastic children! This week, we have spent time remembering our routines and expectations after our week off, and enjoying being back together. In maths we have learning to count objects, actions and sounds, linking the number to a numeral (1,2 and 3) and representing the number in different ways. In phonics we recapped all of our phonics sounds and common exception words from last term, and then practised sounding out each sound and blending to read simple CVC words (e.g. h-u-g, b-i-g, l-u-ck). Our reading book this week was 'Tip, Sip, Nap'. You can access this book and all our class phonics books through the Collins BIG CAT link in your child's reading record. We encourage you to read these books as often as possible, until your child is reading all the words independently and confidently, without having to say each sound out loud. We have introduced and thought about our question for the term 'I wonder what celebrations are all about?' The children have loved looking through the photos you have shared with us (Thank you!) and talking about how they have celebrated in different ways. In RE, we heard the story of Noah from the Old Testament and in PE we used our balancing, stretching and travelling skills to remember and re-tell the story. We talked about fireworks and the children loved creating their own fireworks with paint, chalk, glitter, foam and construction!

Year 1 Mrs O'Keeffe and Mr Mead

It has been such a joy to welcome Year 1 children back after half term! We have loved seeing their bright smiles, ready for a new term of fantastic learning. Our theme this term is Change. Throughout the term we will be looking at how the world has changed and changes in animals and humans too. This week, the children played 'Guess Who' with their own baby photos. We looked at features and tried to match up the correct baby photo with who they are now. They identified all the different ways they have changed and celebrated how they have grown through learning too. Next week, we will begin to think about how the world has changed, and look at clues from the past which tell us about life before humans. For Imagination Week in English we have started reading Tad by Benji Davis. The children collected lots of vocabulary through acting out the story, creating their own characters, and exploring how to jump like a frog! They built on their knowledge of exciting adjectives and verbs. Next week, they will begin to use their vocabulary to describe a characters appearance and personality. In Maths, we learnt how to partition a single digit number into different combinations using a part-whole model. Next week, they will use this knowledge to find fact families within addition, recording these as number sentences. For PE this term will be exploring Dance and learning about different styles and music, starting next week with breakdancing! Please make sure your child has a full PE kit. PE will be outside when possible so we recommend including joggers for this term of year. We hope our children and families have a nice weekend.

Year 2 Mrs Martin and Mrs Cohen

Year 2 have had an amazing first week back after half term! The children immersed themselves into the new Text for English – 'The Blue Giant' and thought about onomatopoeia relating to the story. They used musical instruments to represent sounds of the ocean including, whoosh, crash and crackle. They worked together to create a whale using only plastic and recycled materials as well as visiting the beach to help our environment by doing a beach clean! In maths, the children have been adding and subtracting and using their knowledge to create and find fact families. Next week they will continue to add and subtract by finding more and less than given numbers. The children had a fantastic time in PE learning all about Line Dancing! They learnt and copied a routine before working together to choreograph their own Line Dance in small groups. Next week the dance style will be Break Dance! In art this week, the children revisited their learning on primary colours and extended this to mix primary colours to make secondary colours and then used them to create tertiary colours in their own colour wheel! Next week they will use their colour mixing skills to add white and black to create different tints and shades. We hope you all have a wonderful weekend.
