Weekly Year Group Recap

Sunbeams Mrs Humphreys

This week in Sunbeams we have been finding different ways to make marks. We used our fingers to make marks in sand or foam, and used our whole hands to print butterflies which we then embellished using dobbers dipped in paint and pencils. We have begun to explore rhyme through the story Oi Dog as well as through rhyming games and of course when singing nursery rhymes. Mrs Memmott brought a train whistle to our music session on Tuesday. She sang about a train and the children pretended to be the carriages, following behind her singing with her, and responding to the train whistle with a change in movement. If you have any spare woolly hats or gloves at home that you no longer need, we would be very grateful to have them so that we have a stock of spares for emergencies. Thank you.

Year R Mrs Keeble and Mrs Hopkins

This week we have been so impressed with the way Reception children have been remembering and enjoying our nativity songs. In *Drawing Club*, our story focus was the animation 'Willo the Wisp' and our vocabulary words were 'fearless', 'dawdle' 'teeny weeny' and 'loop the loop.' Can your children show you the actions and tell you the meanings? They were so excited to bring the story to life by writing and showing numbers in different ways. In maths we have been finding different ways to make 4 and 5. In RE we have been learning about some of the stories that Christians share from the Bible and thinking about how they show Christians that God and Jesus love them. In PE we loved exploring the dance genre of break dancing, watching videos of professionals performing their dance before trying out different moves ourselves. Please could you help us get ready for our nativity by providing the clothes detailed on the slip sent home and encourage your child to practice their lines if they have a speaking part too.

Year 1 Mrs O'Keeffe and Mr Mead

This week has been full of fabulous new learning for our children in Year 1! In History this week, we have continued to look at our theme of change. We did this by focusing on fossils as evidence that the world has changed. The children made salt dough fossils and experimented like a palaeontologist by excavating from the sand. In science, we have been learning about the 5 different animal types and categorised different types reptiles and amphibians, looking closely at their characteristics. In Maths we have used our knowledge of part whole models to assist us in finding number bonds within 10. Once the children practically showed the number bonds, they were able to write number sentences systematically showing all the ways of making the given number. In English, it has been our imagination week! We have started our research into a significant person. The person we have chosen is Mary Anning and the children have discovered many interesting facts about her. We went on a rather chilly trip to the beach where we went fossil hunting and gathered vocabulary to describe texture, patterns and our senses. The children also created their own 'curiosities' and used drama to pretend to be Mary Anning selling them to each other for the price of 1p! The children have loved Dance in PE this term and continued their enthusiasm into Ballet which we found lots of us have already experienced during clubs outside of school. This meant we were able to showcase and teach our friends valuable Ballet skills. We hope you all have a fantastic weekend and we are already looking forward to welcoming our Year 1 children back to school on Monday.

Year 2 Mrs Martin and Mrs Cohen

Year 2 have had a fabulous week this week! We started the story 'Space Tortoise' in English and revealed parts of the story each week as part of our imagination week. Before reading the story, we found mystery items such as tin foil, stars, torches and a tortoise which helped us predict what the story might be about. We also made pulley tortoises to help them reach the stars and made a constellation of friendships while thinking about the qualities of a good friend. Next week we will be thinking about asking questions and writing questions from the tortoise to the animals in the sky. In Maths the children have been fantastic at using their number bond knowledge to add to the next 10. Next week, we will be continuing to use these skills to add across 10 (24+8) by adding to the next ten, plus the rest (24+6=30+2). In art this week we explored painting using a range of techniques in the style of Jackson Pollock including marble rolling, string painting, and flicking. Next week we will be exploring how paint differs on different textures before deciding which texture to paint on to create a planet effect. We had great fun learning ballet moves in PE before choreographing our own ballet dance - next week we will learn Irish dancing! Wishing our families a wonderful weekend.
