

Weekly Year Group Recap

Sunbeams Mrs Humphreys

This week in Sunbeams we have continued to develop our understanding of size. We have used playdough to make our own caterpillars or spiders of different sizes after watching short clips from the Miniscule series to inspire us. On Tuesday Mrs Memmott sang her Gruffalo song with the children, incorporating all the animals from the story. The children joined in with the song and moved in different ways in response to each of the animals. On Thursday morning, Chartwells hosted a Hungry Caterpillar workshop for Sunbeams in the main school hall. We learned a little bit about making healthy choices with food and when read the story we thought about the choices the caterpillar had made. We then created our own artworks from fruit and vegetables before tucking into them! We wish all our Sunbeams families and restful half term and look forward to seeing you in a weeks time.

Year R Mrs Keeble and Mrs Hopkins

Well done to all our children and families for a brilliant first half term at school. We have been reflecting on how much progress the children have made in their new environment, feeling confident with their grown-ups, and learning new routines, skills and knowledge. The children were fantastic representatives of our school community as they attended our shared Harvest worship in the Church with the rest of the school. This week, we have learnt our last set of sounds for the term – h, b, f &l. We have read a worded book for the first time as a class using the sounds we have learnt. You will find the log in details in your child's reading record to access the same book on Collins Hub, our online library. Please follow the link to read the books that your child has been reading in lessons. We encourage you to read these books as often as possible, until your child is reading all the words independently and confidently, without having to say each sound out loud. In maths the children have learnt to recognise and create repeating patterns, using two or more natural objects. In music, the children showed remarkable listening skills as they continued to develop their singing, awareness of pitch and movement with Mrs Memmott. We hope you can enjoy some fun time with your lovely children at half term!

<u>Year 1</u> Mrs O'Keeffe and Mr Mead

It's been a wonderful week in Year 1 as we thinking about all the amazing learning we have explored this term already! This week the children have dazzled us with their setting descriptions of the Whitstable Flood. They have used exciting adjectives to describe senses and produce Powerful Writing! In maths, they practised number formation in creative ways including painting, collage and chalk writing. Whilst in Art, we took the opportunity to celebrate the beauty of seasonal change and create autumn leaf collages themed around animals and people. In RE this term, the children have been learning about God and how Christians show their beliefs and this week children reflected on their learning to think about what Christians believe God is like. They created beautiful simile sentence such as 'God is bright like a rainbow.' We also took the time to celebrate what we have learnt and enjoyed this term. The children showed Remarkable Retrieval when sharing their learning about testing materials, exploring maps and talking about who helps our community and how Whitstable has changed. Next term our theme will be 'How has the World changed?' where we will be thinking about changes in humans, animals and the land. To inspire our learning, we will be thinking about how the children have changed first. We would like all children in Year 1 to bring in a photo of themselves from when they were a baby or toddler. We are so proud of how well children in Oysters and Pearls have settled into their new classes this term, built relationships with their teachers and learnt new routines. It has been a joy to get to know them individually and we are excited for the start of Term 2 already!

Year 2 Mrs Martin and Mrs Cohen

We are so immensely proud of our wonderful Year 2 children completing their first term as Seagulls and Puffins! The children had a fantastic last week in school – thank you to those who were able to attend the Harvest Service, it was lovely to see so many families at the Church! In English, the children re-wrote part of the story 'Emma Jane's Aeroplane' using the same style and tone as the author – they chose their own verbs to use and adapted the narrative slightly to make it their own! In maths they have been taking part in a variety of practical activities to recap their addition and subtraction knowledge from Year 1 to build on in the first week back after half term where they will learn how to use number bonds to 10 to make number bonds to 20 and find related facts. The focus text in English will be 'The Blue Giant'. The children will be thinking about how plastic and littering is affecting our world and what they can do to help. This week they have learnt a little more about Christopher Columbus and created their own world map and mini boat to sail across the world. Next term our learning theme is 'innovate' where we will explore the question 'How do innovations help us explore beyond our world?'. The children will continue to learn about methods of flight and begin to think about how rockets have helped humans travel to space! We hope all of our lovely families has a restful half term and we are looking forward to seeing you again on Tuesday 28th October!
